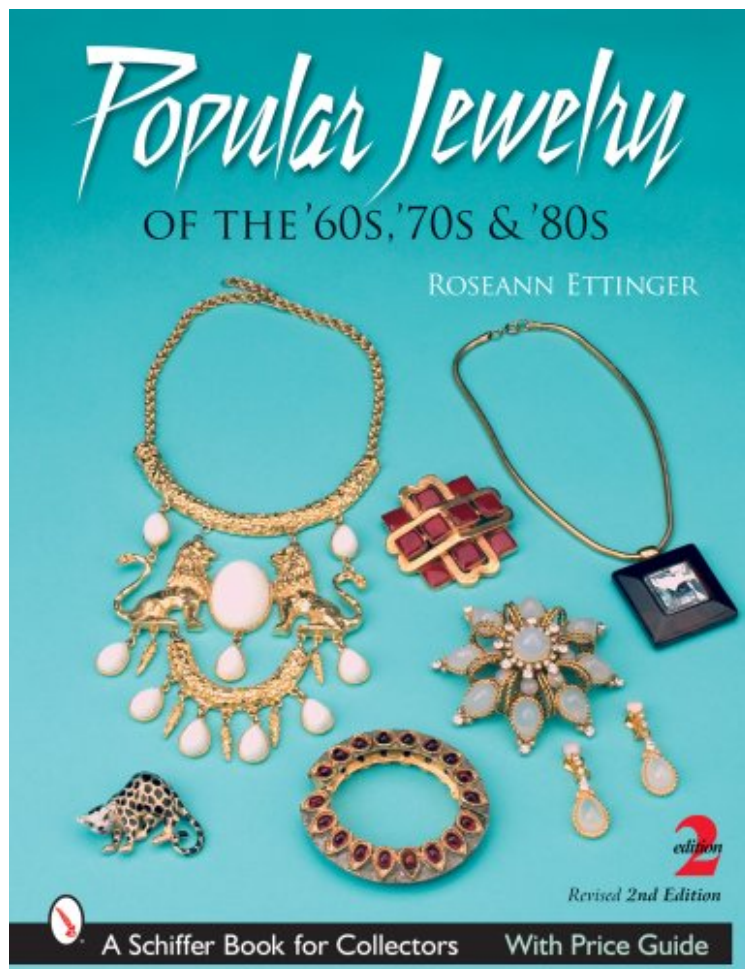

The author does a great job covering costume jewelry trends from the 1960s to the 1980s. Mod, medieval, eastern, abstract, floral, zodiac, bicentennial are just a few of the themes found in the jewelry that were popular in those years. Well-photographed samples of necklaces, pins, brooches, earrings and bracelets from each

decade will amaze and inspire collectors and designers alike. Ettinger also provides short informative articles on each trend and devotes a couple of pages each to Avon, Sarah Coventry and Miriam Haskell jewelry. I enjoyed this book very much although I thought it would have been even more beneficial to the readers if the author had included measurements in the descriptions. Nevertheless, this book definitely belongs in every jewelry lover and collector's library. It is a wonderful visual reference to the jewelry of three decades that only now collectors are beginning to appreciate and seek.

Costume jewelry is increasingly sought-out and appreciated by a growing number of collectors. Pieces made by important designers from the sixties, seventies and eighties are the most highly prized, with today's teenagers wearing vintage Hippie and Mod jewelry and prices are escalating. Over 600 color photographs and 60 advertising pieces are presented to display the variety in these popular adornments.
