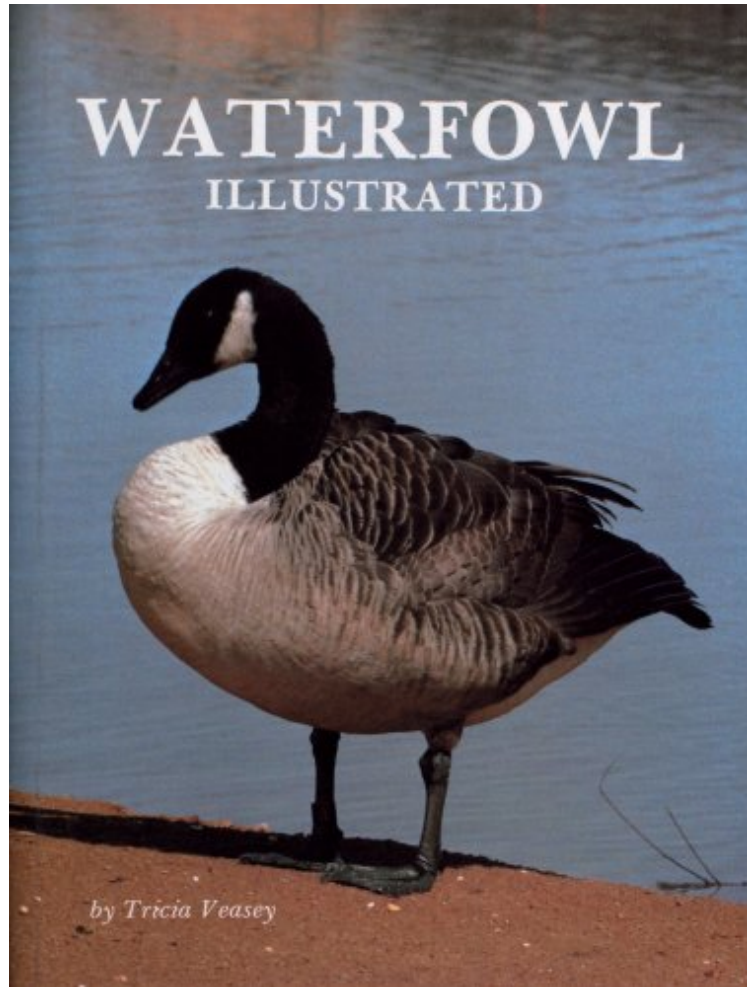

About half the photos are black white, and therefore less useful to carving and painting enthusiasts like myself. Many of the photos also lack sharp focus, which is practically a must for those hoping to use the photos for reference.In addition, some N.American species are missing from the book, while a few European birds

appear instead. Still, the book is probably a better collection of photos than the ones you've taken, and as such it may be a useful reference for the better-photographed species included.
